EMERGENCY ROOM

Symptoms that require ER care:

- · Dizziness or weakness that does not go away
- Inhaled smoke or poisonous fumes
- · Sudden confusion
- Heavy bleeding
- Possible broken bone with loss of movement, especially if the bone is pushing through the skin
- · Deep wound
- · Serious burn
- Coughing or throwing up blood
- · Severe pain anywhere in the body
- Severe allergic reaction with trouble breathing, swelling, hives
- High fever with headache and stiff neck
- · High fever that doesn't get better with medicine
- Throwing up or loose stools that don't stop
- · Poisoning or overdose of drug or alcohol
- · Suicidal thoughts
- Seizures
