

Family Alzheimer's In-Home Respite

FAIR gives caregivers a temporary timeout—a brief respite from caregiving responsibilities.

What is FAIR?

FAIR—is a program designed to provide care and activities for individuals with Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia and give family caregivers a needed break.

What services are provided?

A trained worker can go into the home to provide:

•• A regular break for caregivers •• Activities and companionship for the person with dementia.

What are the eligibility requirements for FAIR?

- •• The person receiving care must have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia
- .. There has to be an unpaid caregiver
- •• The care must be provided in West Virginia

Is there a charge for FAIR services?

The cost for FAIR services is based on a sliding fee scale.

- •• WV Lottery funded program •• Is available in all 55 counties
- •• Meets unique needs of Alzheimer's caregivers
- •• Provides workers who understand Alzheimer's disease and related dementias
- •• Is designed to give individual attention to each person with dementia.
